

GARDENA POLICE DEPARTMENT'S EXPLORER COMPETITION



On January 18, 2019 the Gardena Police Department's Explorers traveled many hours to participate in the Annual Explorer's Tactical Competition held in Chandler, Arizona. During this national, two-day competition, they are joined by over 50 other police agencies around the country including California, Illinois, Nevada, Arizona, and Minnesota. It is created to simulate real life, SWAT-based scenarios such as crisis negotiations and vehicle assault. It puts teamwork, problem solving skills, and working well under pressure abilities to the ultimate test by displaying realistic scenarios that truly utilize critical thinking like police officers. Explorers are scored based on officer safety techniques, timing, strategies, and communication within the team. The physical portion of this competition includes a three-mile run, an obstacle course, and a SWAT Fitness Challenge.

Our Gardena Explorer's team returned back home with eleven trophies won in various tactical competitions. We are very proud and honor to have these amazing Explorer's part of the Gardena Police Department !

The Gardena Police Department is excited to open up the first Collision Reporting Center in Southern California. The Collison Reporting Center is a facility where the members of the public can report traffic collisions to meet state legal requirements and insurance needs. This service is offered for collisions that occur within Gardena city limits.

With this new center, traffic collision reporting can move out of the road and into a safe and comfortable facility and will clear any traffic collision congestion. This new service is provided for the residents of Gardena at no cost.

Steps to be taken by all drivers before arriving at the Collision Reporting Center:

- 1. If it is safe to do so, remove vehicle from roadway.
- Exchange information with the other involved driver/parties, including independent witnesses. Obtain name, addresses, phone numbers, insurance and vehicle information, including plate number.
- 3. As soon as possible, go to the Collision Reporting Center with you vehicle. If your vehicle is drivable, it is advised that you report your collision within 48 hours. If your vehicle is disabled and requires a tow, the tow company will transport you and your vehicle to the Collison Reporting Center, directly from the scene.
- Bring your documentation with you to the Collision Reporting Center (i.e. driver's license, vehicle registration and insurance. The driver must report to the Collison Reporting Center with the vehicle.

The center is located on 16206 S. Western Ave Suite G, Gardena, CA 90247 (310) 817-4611, and the hours of operation is Monday-Friday 10 am-6pm and closed weekends and holidays.

How to create a Vegetable Gardgen

January is a perfect time to start off the new year with planning your vegetable garden. Here are some friendly tips on how to plant your garden:

1. **Pick the right location**. Picking a good location for your garden is absolutely key.

2. **Plant in a sunny location**. Most vegetables need at least 6 hours of direct sunlight per day.

3. **Plant in good soil**. Plant's roots penetrate soft soil more easily, so you need nice loamy soil.

4. **Plant is a stable environment.** You don't want to plant in a place that's' prone to flooding during heavy rains, or in a place that tends to dry out a lot.

5. **Space your crops properly**. Plants set too close together compete for sunlight, water, and nutrition and fail to mature.

6. **Water properly.** Watering your plants the correct amount will give them the best chance at producing well-formed, mature vegetables (Sourcehttps://www.almanac.com/vegetable-gardening-for-beginners)
