






Rowley Park Improvements Coming Soon!

Tennis Court Resurfacing & Fencing (Phase I) – Construction in Spring 2019

The project includes resurfacing all (four) tennis courts; patch cracks and spalls, grind any high spots and peeling areas, new resurfacing coats and striping. In addition, the project includes replacing and/or sleeving existing fence posts, rails & braces, chain-link & windscreen, gates, and all necessary hardware and fittings to complete the project. The





The auditorium AV upgrade area is approximately 43'x60' open space with 8'-12' ceiling height. The facility is a single level block wall structure built in 1962 with original AV equipment. The project includes but not limited to; furnishing all labor, tools, transportation, equipment and materials for audio, video, switching & distribution control, cables & connectors and all related work necessary to complete the project. The construction schedule is 7 working days and is to be completed by end of Spring 2019.

Auditorium Classroom Remodel (Phase II) – Construction in Spring 2019

The proposed two remodel classrooms are approximately 60'x16' combined. The project includes replacing existing glass windows to energy efficient duel pane and damaged doors; replace ceiling and flooring tiles, new drywalls, paint, base board, writing boards, LED light fixtures & control, TV displays & outlets, and all related work necessary to complete the remodel. The construction schedule is 15 working days and is to be completed by end of Spring 2019.

Replace Sun Shade Structure (Phase III) – Construction in Summer 2019

The project is to replace the existing 60-year old wood shade structure with new fabric shade. The new shade structure is to be 60'x30' made of sustainable and durable fabrics that requires less material than canvas, wood, or steel. Fabric shades are easier to replace and allow greater air circulation unlike other materials that trap heat. The design and built is to take approximately six months and to be completed by July 2019.

New Restroom Building (Phase IV) – Construction in Winter 2019-20

The project is to replace the existing 60-year old restroom building with new modular building. Intent is to maintain the similar footprint area but to comply with the current ADA, energy efficient, and all other required State codes. The project is also to be partially funded by CDBG Funds, which will require federal provisions. The schedule is the complete the project by end of winter 2019-20.




