Dear Neighbor,

The City of Gardena offers a better quality of life than some other nearby communities and we want to continue to provide the essential city services that residents expect and deserve. In a City of Gardena Community Issues Survey conducted this year, 78% of residents believed the City has a real need for additional funds to provide the level of city services that residents need and want.

Residents also identified local priorities that they would like the City to continue to address, including:

- keeping public areas safe and clean
- repairing streets and potholes
- maintaining firefighters and paramedics
- protecting local drinking water supplies
- maintaining 911 emergency response times
- maintaining senior services
- maintaining vital city services, and
- maintaining gang and drug prevention programs.

The City seeks to maintain quality services that many Gardena senior citizens and families rely on free or low-cost hot meals served at the community center, and cultural and recreation programs. Additional locally-controlled funding is needed to make it possible to continue these important services, such as the City's affordable supervised day care program for residents with dementia and Alzheimer's Disease, giving Gardena's working families peace-of-mind knowing that their parents and grandparents are safe.



PARKING, DO'S AND DON'T'S

Parking disputes between neighbor's ranks as one of the top five dispatched calls our police respond to. By understanding the basic rules surrounding parking and practicing some common sense and courtesy. The rules, according to the Gardena Police Department's lead parking enforcement officer are as follows:

Rule #1

As much as some people would like to think, you do not own the parking spaces in front of your home. In our neighborhood, we have an unspoken rule that we try to always park in front of our own house and our neighbors generally reciprocate. In essence, we are respectful of our neighbor's spaces, and they are respectful of ours.



Rule #2

It is against the law to park on the street blocking a driveway even with permission from the owner and even your own driveway. As a law, this is a judgement call by the police, who may or may not decide to enforce it, especially if parking is tight on a block due to parties, holidays, etc. Still, they can issue a citation by law.

Rule #3

The transition from the curb to the actual driveway is known as the 'apron' and is technically another no-man's-land of parking. Like the aforementioned Rule #4 though, it is also a judgement call by parking enforcement. Even if you aren't cited however, you run the risk of having your car run into by people attempting to enter or exit their driveway.
